

What are Alternative Spring **Break Trips?**

Alternative Spring Break Trips are one week long and scheduled to coincide with the major university breaks. Volunteers work together in a group on a service project arranged by our expert local staff. Spring break volunteers receive the same benefits as our longer-term volunteers, including food and accommodation. Volunteers can choose between Building, Care. Conservation, International Development, Medicine and Public Health trips, depending on their interests and majors. Throughout the week, participants will have the opportunity to meet other volunteers, participate in cultural and social activities at night, and will have Friday afternoons off to explore the area a bit more.

All of the locations of our Alternative Spring Break Trips are as close as possible to minimize time lost to travel and jet lag. Most destinations offer direct flight options from the US.

Project Work: Volunteers on this trip will have the opportunity to assist in the construction of improved sanitation facilities for local schools, as well as working on installing running water



systems. There are 40 schools in the region that Projects Abroad works in that need this type of upgrade, so this project will benefit hundreds of children. Typical activities include digging foundations, mixing mortar, laying blocks, and carrying materials. No construction experience is required, just a desire to work hard and lend a hand.

Tourism & Accommodation: Volunteers on this project live with local host families in Mandeville, a lively town in the rolling hills of south-west Jamaica. At the end of the week you will be rewarded for your hard work with a trip to the beach or a refreshing waterfall.

Project Work: On the Care trip in Belize, you will work with underprivileged children at a care center or kindergarten. Here, you have the opportunity to get involved with various daily



activities, including running educational activities and games, helping with homework, preparing for mealtime, and playing with the children. Additionally, you can give back to your placement by painting a colorful mural or refurbishing a play area.

Tourism & Accommodation: During your time in Belize, you will live with a host family in San Pedro, a town on the southern part of the island of Ambergris Caye. At the end of the week, you can relax with the other volunteers with a trip to the beach, where you can enjoy snorkeling and scuba diving or you can explore the sights of San Pedro.

Project Work: While other spring breakers may go to Costa Rica to spend their time at a resort, on this Care project you can instead spend your time improving the lives of local



Costa Rican children. Care volunteers will work together at local child care centers, helping the staff of the facility care for the children. The group will have plenty of opportunities to plan activities for the kids, as well as opportunities to help with their English skills.

Tourism & Accommodation: Volunteers will stay in the vibrant suburban town of Heredia just outside of San José. This project is a great choice if you are studying or want to learn Spanish since you will be living with a local host family, where you can really put your language abilities to the test. At the end of the week you can wind down by seeing some of the sites of the San José area.

Project Work: As a volunteer in Fiji, you will be able to provide a helping hand by caring for children in kindergartens. It is also the perfect opportunity to put any skills and interests

Tourism & Accommodation: Although Fiji has an abundance of natural resources and a rapidly growing tourism industry, little of this income reaches local communities. You will be able to see this firsthand in Nadi, as well as getting an idea of the local quality of life through your stay with a host family. At the end of the week, volunteers can explore one of the beautiful local beaches with clear turquoise water.

Tourism & Accommodation: Volunteers will live with Ghanaian host families. This is a wonderful opportunity for cultural exchange and learning about day-to-day life in Ghana first-hand! At the end of the week, volunteers will enjoy a tour of Cape Coast and a visit to some of Ghana's most colorful and lively markets.


Project Work: Volunteers on the Care trip in Jamaica work at orphanages or care centers supporting the children and local staff. Volunteers are involved with various daily activities,

Project Work: Volunteer in the heart of the Amazon Rainforest on the Taricaya Ecological Reserve, where you will spend your time working on a number of conservation programs and



activities. You can work with rescued animals, do research on the forest's natural wildlife, and even learn some carpentry skills. Your activities will offer valuable assistance in ongoing efforts to protect the increasingly threatened biodiversity of the Amazon Rainforest.

Tourism & Accommodation: Volunteers on the Conservation project will live all together in shared volunteer bungalows located on the Taricaya Ecological Reserve. At the end of the week, volunteers can celebrate their hard work by relaxing and swimming at the reserve.

shadowing local doctors and attending medical workshops in a hospital. The remaining time will be spent in local communities leading outreach campaigns about dental hygiene. The program also features a visit to an anatomy museum, a dissection class, and a medical Spanish lesson.

Tourism & Accommodation: During your time in Argentina, you will live with a local host family. Projects Abroad staff will organize fun activities in the evenings where you can socialize with the rest of the group, and you will also have free time on Friday to explore the beautiful city of Cordoba.

Project Work: As a Public Health volunteer in Belize, you will help run campaigns that focus on preventing diseases and the importance of healthy living, as well as providing basic

You will facilitate discussions about hypertension, diabetes, HIV/ AIDS, sexually transmitted diseases, alcohol and drug abuse, and the positive influence of good hygiene. This knowledge is a powerful tool for the local communities.

Tourism & Accommodation: Volunteers in Belize will live with local host families and have the opportunity to be fully immersed in the local culture and learn about daily life in Belize. At the end of the week you will visit some of Belize's most beautiful beaches.

Project Work: Volunteers on the Public Health trip in Ghana will help with community-based medical outreach work and public health campaigns. The group will get involved with



activities such as medical check-ups for children at orphanages, dressing wounds in a leprosy camp, performing checks of vitals on babies, immunization drives, as well as discussions on health and hygiene with local schools and community groups.

Tourism & Accommodation: During your time in Ghana you will live with a local host family in the town of Dodowa, in the greater Accra region. Known for its festivals and its forest, Dodowa will be a great base for your week in Ghana, and during your time off you can explore all the town has to offer.



Getting there & back

- Although flights are not included in the program fee, our Travel Team is available to book your flights.
- Volunteeers will fly to the destination on Sunday, and return the following Saturday.
 Pickup and drop off at the airport is included, and there will be someone there to meet the group.
- The projects are located at some of our closest destinations so there won't be too much jet lag.



Visas and Insurance

For most of the destinations, you will not need a visa. For any that you do need a visa, we will give you the relevant documents and advice. As we go to press, prices for visas range from \$50 to \$350 depending on the destination. Projects Abroad prices include insurance coverage for your outward and return journeys (except for overnight stays in your home country) and throughout your placement. Coverage includes medical expenses, luggage and personal effects, money, cancellation and curtailment, legal expenses, and emergency assistance. Coverage becomes effective once full payment has been received. Extra leisure travel insurance can also be arranged for an additional premium.

Amendments & Cancellations

The charge for amendments ranges from \$75 to \$130 plus the amount charged to Projects Abroad by third parties. Cancellation charges depend on how far in advance of your departure date we have been informed in writing:

- Notice of 3 months or more- \$100
- Notice of 2-3 months- One third of total cost
- Notice of 1-2 months- Two thirds of total cost
- Notice of less than 1 month- No refund

Please note that the above cancellation charges apply whether an application is made more than three months before the proposed departure date or less than three months before the departure date. Deposits paid in relation to departure not more than three months ahead are non-refundable. If you have made your fina payment, cancellation insurance may be available under certain circumstances.
